Registration closing time

We wish to remind parents and carers regarding attendance and the marking of the school's register.

Children should be on the school site by 8.45am, with the school gates closing shortly after this time. If any children arrive after this time they should enter via the main entrance and report to the school office. The register for morning school will close at 8.50am and for afternoon school 1.15pm. Any children arriving in school after these times will be recorded as 'Late after the register has closed'.

The actual time and reason for late arrival will be recorded and entered by office staff.

Attendance registers are reviewed regularly by our Education Welfare Officer. Any persistent late entries may result in being contacted directly by this service.

Summer Uniform reminders

As the warmer weather is just around the corner can we just remind parents of our Summer uniform code.

Year 6 Cycling to school



We are offering **Year 6 pupils** who have successfully completed their **Safer Cycling Certificate** the opportunity to cycle to school subject to their parent's permission. If any Year 6 pupils would like to cycle to school then please give your permission by logging in to the Schoolgateway. Access to the school site for cyclists will be via Cedar gate only so that bicycles can be parked in the cycle pod easily. Cycle helmets MUST be worn on journeys to and from school and these can be stored with the bikes.

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Headlice—Take a Peak Once a Week!

There have recently been cases of head lice identified in school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed.

A number of children are currently wearing their long hair loose and as head lice are passed particularly quickly via long hair, it needs to be tied back whilst at school.



It is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread too far. We suggest that you check your child's head during the **Easter break.**

Follow the simple **CHECK**, **TREAT**, **COMPLETE** routine below to ensure you are doing your bit to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

CHECK


- Your child's hair once a week.
- Use a proper detection comb white in colour (so they can de easily identified) with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice.
- If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist for treatment advice.
- If head lice are spotted, take a close look at all the family, including yourself and ask close family and friends to check as well.

TREAT

- Only treat if live lice are identified.
- Use a clinically proven treatment, ideally with a physical mode of action to which lice are very unlikely to build a resistance.
- Leave the treatment on for the recommended time for maximum effect leaving it on for longer will not make it more effective.

COMPLETE

- Repeat the treatment for a second time seven day after the first to kill any lice that may hatch from eggs during that time – if the pack instructions specify that a second application is required.
- Check that all head lice have gone within two to three days of the final application of head lice treatment to complete the process.
- Continue to check for head lice on a regular, weekly basis.




